# 8 Weeks Before the Move

Create a Moving Binder: Start a dedicated binder or digital folder to keep all moving-related documents and information in one place.

Set a Budget: Determine your moving budget, including costs for hiring movers, supplies, and any other related expenses.

	<b>Towels:</b> Include a few bath towels and hand towels for bathing.
	Toilet paper: Ensure you have enough for immediate use.

	<b>Bedding:</b> Include a set of sheets, pillows, and blankets for each bed you'll be using on the first night.
	<b>Prescription medications:</b> If anyone in your household takes regular medications have a supply for a few days.

	<b>Chargers:</b> Bring chargers for your smartphones, tablets, and other essential devices.
	Laptop or tablet: If needed for work or entertainment.
	Books or magazines: For relaxation during downtime.
Im	portant Documents
	Identification: Keep passports, driver's licenses, and any other crucial identification documents.
	<b>Lease or closing documents:</b> If applicable, have copies of your rental or purchase agreements.
	Contact information: A list of important phone numbers and contact details.

	Torch: In case of power outages or navigating in the dark.
	<b>Toolkit:</b> Include a basic toolkit with a screwdriver, pliers, and a utility knife.
	Batteries: Have spare batteries for torches and other essential items.

	Meet the Movers: Be present when the movers arrive to oversee the process.
	Take Inventory: Check off items as they are loaded onto the moving truck.
	Turn Off Utilities: Ensure all utilities are turned off before leaving your old home.

	<b>Unload and Unpack:</b> Supervise the unloading and unpacking at your new home.
	<b>Inspect for Damages:</b> Check for any damages to your belongings during the move and report them to the moving company.
	<b>Update Your Address:</b> Update your address with the new post office, banks, and other necessary institutions.
	Set Up Utilities: Arrange for utilities to be connected at your new home.

## Cleaning Checklist

Ge	neral Cleaning	
	<b>Dust and wipe down all surfaces:</b> This includes countertops, shelves, window sills, and skirting boards.	
	<b>Clean light fixtures:</b> Remove dust, cobwebs, and any insects. Replace burnt-out light bulbs.	
	<b>Clean switches and sockets:</b> Wipe down switch plates and outlets. Ensure they are free of fingerprints and stains.	
	Clean ceiling fans: Dust and wipe down the blades and fixtures.	
	<b>Wipe down doors and frames:</b> Clean and disinfect doorknobs, handles, and frames.	
	<b>Clean vents and grilles:</b> Remove dust and debris from heating/cooling vents and grilles.	
	<b>Clean windows:</b> Wash both the inside and outside of windows, including frames and sills.	
	Clean mirrors: Use a glass cleaner to clean mirrors throughout the property.	
	<b>Vacuum or sweep and mop all floors:</b> Pay special attention to corners and edges.	
Kitchen		
	<b>Clean appliances:</b> Clean the refrigerator, oven, stove, microwave, and dishwasher inside and out. Remove any food residue and stains.	
	Clean and disinfect countertops: Remove any stains or residues.	
	Clean sink and taps: Remove limescale, stains, and polish the faucets.	
	Clean cabinets and drawers: Wipe down both the interior and exterior surfaces.	
	<b>Empty and clean the bins:</b> Wash and disinfect the bins inside and out.	

Bathroom	
	<b>Clean and disinfect the toilet:</b> Pay attention to the bowl, seat, and the area around the base.
	<b>Clean and disinfect the shower and bathtub:</b> Remove soap scum, mold, and mildew.
	<b>Clean and disinfect the sink and taps:</b> Remove limescale, stains, and soap residue.
	<b>Clean bathroom tiles:</b> Wipe down tiles on walls and floors, removing any mold or soap scum.
	Clean and polish mirrors: Ensure they are streak-free.
	Clean cabinets and drawers: Wipe down both the interior and exterior surfaces.

$\bigcirc$	<b>Dust and clean all surfaces:</b> Including dressers, nightstands, and shelves.
	<b>Vacuum or clean under furniture:</b> Move furniture if possible and clean underneath.
	Clean cupboards: Remove any remaining belongings and dust shelves and rods.
Liv	ing and Dining Rooms
$\bigcirc$	Clean and dust all surfaces: Including tables, chairs, and entertainment centers.
	<b>Vacuum or clean under furniture:</b> Move furniture if possible and clean underneath.
	<b>Clean carpets or rugs:</b> Vacuum thoroughly and consider professional cleaning if necessary.
Ou	tdoor Areas
	<b>Sweep and clean entryways:</b> Remove leaves, debris, and cobwebs from the entrance.

	<b>Mow the lawn:</b> If you have a lawn, mow it and trim any overgrown bushes or plants.
	Clean the patio or balcony: Sweep, wash, and remove any outdoor furniture.
Fin	ial Touches
	Dispose of trash: Empty all trash cans and take the trash to the designated area.
	<b>Replace any damaged items:</b> Repair or replace any damaged fixtures or items, if required, to avoid deductions from your security deposit.
	<b>Check for personal items:</b> Ensure you haven't left any personal belongings behind.
	<b>Photograph the property:</b> Take photos of the cleaned property as evidence of its condition.
